

Twenty-Ninth Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This Sunday we celebrate World Mission Sunday, organized by the Propagation of the Faith. It is a day set aside for Catholics worldwide to recommit themselves to the Church's missionary activity through prayer and sacrifice. As described by Pope John

Paul II, World Mission Sunday is "an important day in the life of the Church because it teaches how to give: as an offering made to God, in the Eucharistic celebration and for all the missions of the world".

Mission dioceses, about 1,100 at this time, receive regular annual assistance from the funds collected. In addition, these mission dioceses submit requests to the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples for assistance, among other needs, for catechetical programs, seminaries, the work of Religious Communities, for communication and transportation needs, and for the building of chapels, churches, orphanages and schools. These needs are matched with the funds gathered in each year. Let us pray and support the mission activities of the Catholic Church.

Every year the needs of the Catholic Church in the Missions grow as new dioceses are formed, as new seminaries are opened because of the growing number of young men hearing Christ's call to follow Him as priests, as areas devastated by war or natural disaster are rebuilt, and as other areas, long suppressed, are opening up to hear the message of Christ and His Church. That is why the involvement and commitment of Catholics from around the world is so urgently needed. Offerings from Catholics in the United States, on World Mission Sunday and throughout the year, are combined with offerings to the Propagation of the Faith worldwide.



SAINT JOHN PAUL II, POPE MEMORIAL FEAST DAY, OCTOBER 22 Before John Paul II's funeral Mass in St. Peter's Square, hundreds of



thousands of people had waited patiently for a brief moment to pray before his body, which lay in state inside St. Peter's for several days. The media coverage of his funeral was unprecedented.

Presiding at the funeral Mass, Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger—then dean of the College of Cardinals and

later Pope Benedict XVI—concluded his homily by saying: "None of us can ever forget how, in that last Easter Sunday of his life, the Holy Father, marked by suffering, came once more to the window of the Apostolic Palace and one last time gave his blessing urbi et orbi ('to the city and to the world').

"We can be sure that our beloved pope is standing today at the window of the Father's house, that sees us and blesses us. Yes, bless us, Holy Father. We entrust your dear soul to the Mother of God, your Mother, who guided you each day and who will guide you now to the glory of her Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen."

In the Church's universal calendar of feast days the memorial feast day of St. John Paul II is celebrated on October 22, the date of the inauguration of his pontificate in 1978. St. John Paul II, pray for us!

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY SECOND COLLECTION THIS WEEKEND

"It is important to ask ourselves certain questions about our Christian identity and our responsibility as believers in a world marked by confusion, disappointment and frustration, and torn by numerous fratricidal WORLD MISSION wars that unjustly target the innocent. What SUNDAY is the basis of our mission? What is the heart



of our mission? What are the essential approaches we need to take in carrving out our mission? The Church's mission, then, is not to spread a religious ideology, much less to propose a lofty ethical teaching. Many movements throughout the world inspire high ideals or ways to live a meaningful life. Through the mission of the Church, Jesus Christ himself continues to evangelize and act; her mission thus makes present in history the kairos, the favorable time of salvation. Let us never forget that being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a Person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction" (Benedict XVI, Deus Caritas Est, 1). The Gospel is a Person who continually offers himself and constantly invites those who receive him with humble and religious faith to share his life by an effective participation in the paschal mystery of his death and resurrection. Mission reminds the Church that she is not an end unto herself, but a humble instrument and mediation of the Kingdom." - Pope Francis

A special Novena (9 days) of Masses for the deceased begins on November 2nd. The 7:00am Mass celebrated during the week and the 9:00am Mass on Saturday & Sunday will have the Faithful Departed as its intention for this novena. You can enroll the names of all you wish to be remembered at these Masses by using the special envelopes in your boxed set. Additional All Souls Mass envelopes are available at the doors of the Church.

The Book of Rememberance will be placed near the Statue of the Sacred Heart the weekend of October 28th & 29th. The names written in the book are included in our prayers and intercessions during the whole month of November. All are encouraged to write the names of your deceased relatives and friends in the Book of Rememberance.

A special Mass of rememberance will be celebrated for all those who entered into eternal rest October 1, 2017 to September 30, 2018 and had a funeral liturgy celebrated at Sacred Heart. This Mass will be celebrated on Saturday, November 3, at 12:00 PM.
