As we celebrate Veterans Day on November 11th, our hearts go to the families of our soldiers serving at war. Our thoughts are drawn to the sacrifices of our young men and young women overseas. Our memories flash to the past, of the stories of our fathers and grandfathers.

Veterans Day was once known as Armistice Day, proclaimed by President Woodrow Wilson in 1919, to remind the Americans of the tragedies of War. In 1939, a law was passed to make it a federal holiday. Later, the name was changed by Congress in 1954, to honor all American veterans of all wars.

Veterans Day does honor every American man and woman that has served our country in any armed forces. It is celebrated on November 11, the end of World War I (1914-1918). There are celebrations on Veterans Day with speeches and parades. And, special services are always held in Arlington National Cemetery in Arlington, Virginia, at the tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

Canada, Australia, and New Zealand all observe November 11 as Remembrance Day to observe all the people who have died in war.

Let us salute our veterans.

SAINT FRANCES XAVIER CABRINI FIRST U.S. CITIZEN TO BE CANONIZED

Frances Xavier Cabrini was the first United States citizen to be canonized. Her deep trust in the loving care of her God gave her the strength to be a valiant woman doing the work of Christ. Refused admission to the religious order which had educated her to be a teacher, she began charitable work at the House of Providence Orphanage in Cadogno, Italy. In September 1877, she made her vows there and took the religious habit. When the bishop closed the orphanage in 1880, he named Frances prioress of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. Seven young women from the orphanage joined her. Since her early childhood in Italy, Frances had wanted to be a missionary in China but, at the urging of Pope Leo XIII, Frances went west instead of east. She traveled with six sisters to New York City to work with the thousands of Italian immigrants living there. She found disappointment and difficulties with every step. When she arrived in New York, the house intended to be her first orphanage in the United States was not available. The archbishop advised her to return to Italy. But Frances, truly a valiant woman, departed from the archbishop's residence all the more determined to establish that orphanage. And she did. In 35 years, Frances Xavier Cabrini founded 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated and the sick. Seeing great need among Italian immigrants who were losing their faith, she organized schools and adult education classes. Her feast day is November 13th. St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, pray for us!

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 2ND, 2018 FOLLOWING THE 1:30 PM SPANISH MASS


A procession with mariachis will leave the church and make its way to the school cafeteria where there will be great music, delicious food, raffles, and other entertainment.
