## Thirty-Third Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Thanksgiving Day is around the corner. When we think of Thanksgiving we think about family gatherings, holiday meals, turkeys, stuffing, pumpkin pie, Indian corn, holiday parades and giant balloons etc.

President Washington's proclamation said the day of Thanksgiving is "to be devoted by the People of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being, who is the beneficent Author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be--That we may then all unite in rendering unto him our sincere and humble thanks--for his kind care and protection of the People of this Country previous to their becoming a Nation--for the signal and manifold mercies, and the favorable interpositions of his Providence which we experienced in the tranquility, union, and plenty, which we have since enjoyed--for the peaceable and rational manner, in which we have been enabled to establish constitutions of government for our safety and happiness, and particularly the national One now lately instituted--for the civil and religious liberty with which we are blessed; and the means we have of acquiring and diffusing useful knowledge; and in general for all the great and various favors which he hath been pleased to confer upon us."

So Thanksgiving Day should remind us to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor.

Thanksgiving should also remind us of a way of life that we have to live all year long. Thanksgiving gives us a chance to think again about what our relationship to God and to others is to look like, and a chance to see if we have made any progress since last year.

### PRESENTATION OF MARY NOVEMBER 21ST

The account of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Temple is principally based on the Protoevangelium of James, which has been dated by historians prior to the year 200 AD. The story relates that in thanksgiving for the birth of their daughter, Mary, Joachim and Anne decide to consecrate her to God, and bring her, at the age of three years, to the temple in Jerusalem. Mary's presentation in the temple draws parallels to that of the prophet Samuel, whose mother Hannah, like Anne was also thought to be barren, and who offered her child as a gift to God at Shiloh. Mary remained in the Temple until her twelfth year, at which point she was assigned to Joseph as guardian. According to Coptic tradition, her father Joachim died when Mary was six years old and her mother when Mary was eight. While the story is a legend with no foundation in history, the point is to show that even in her childhood Mary was completely dedicated to God. It is from this account that arose the feast of Mary's Presentation. In the 1974 encyclical *Marialis Cultus*, Pope Paul VI wrote that "despite its apocryphal content, it presents lofty and exemplary values and carries on the venerable traditions having their origins in the Eastern churches."

**SUNDAY, DECEMBER 2ND, 2018**

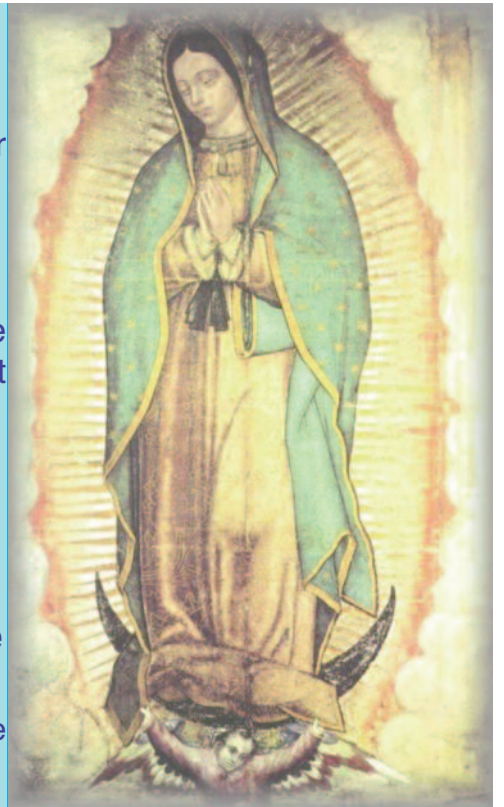
**FOLLOWING THE 1:30 PM SPANISH MASS**
