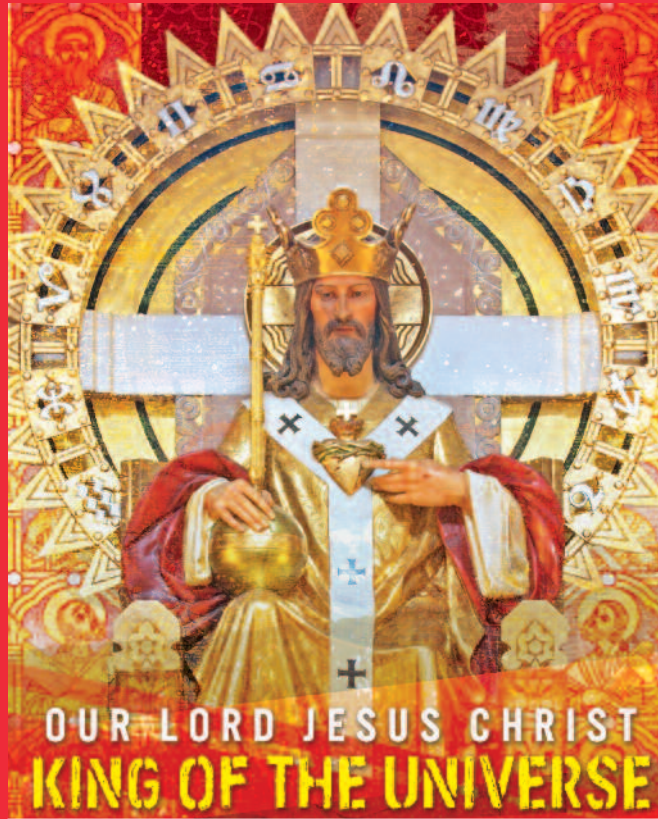

## Our Lord Jesus Christ, King Of The Universe

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Today is the last Sunday in the Church's liturgical year, and the readings fix our attention on Jesus as lord and king of the whole of the created universe.

When we think of king, we are inclined to think first of those who are in charge - who have power to make decisions and to enforce them. However, we need to be careful in putting organizational leadership at the center of our concern. This is because the leadership portrayed by the crucified Jesus is of a different kind. We are taught to look at Jesus on the cross. It is he who is lord and king. The real leadership which we see when we look at the crucifixion is not organizational decision-making leadership. We do not look to the high priest, or to Pilate or Herod to see the real authority and power that stands out on the hill of Calvary. The most important area for leadership lies in the area of love. Christ the king shows us that ultimate power is the power of love. Ultimate authority is the authority that is exercised in loving. Ultimate leadership is leadership in love. Our lord and king is a victim of the unjust exercise of organizational leadership. But no one could stop him loving, and his self-giving love shines out in splendor from the cross. The love that flows from his pierced and broken heart continues to reveal the power of God and to overcome the evil that comes from the abuse of power.

The feast of Christ the King has implications for every aspect of our church life. Its main message, however, is of the power of love in any and every circumstance of life. As we struggle for truth and for justice, let us learn from him to use only the weapons of love, for it is with love that God conquered chaos, and it is with love that Jesus continues to conquer the human heart.

### SAINT ANDREW NOVEMBER 30TH

St. Andrew, also known as Andrew the Apostle, was a Christian Apostle and the older brother to St. Peter. According to the New Testament, Andrew was born in the village of Bethsaida on the Sea of Galilee during the early first century. Much like his younger brother, Simon Peter, Andrew was also a fisherman. Andrew's very name means strong and he was known for having good social skills. In the Gospel of Matthew, it is said Jesus was walking along the shore of the Sea of Galilee and saw Andrew and Simon Peter fishing. It is then he asked the two to become disciples and "fishers of men." Per Christian tradition, Andrew went on to preach the Good News around the shores of the Black Sea and throughout what is now Greece and Turkey. Andrew was martyred by crucifixion in Patras. He was bound, rather than nailed, to a cross, as is described in the Acts of Andrew. He was crucified on a cross form known as "crux decussata," which is an X-shaped cross or a "saltire." Today this is commonly referred to as "St. Andrew's Cross." It is believed Andrew requested to be crucified this way, because he deemed himself "unworthy to be crucified on the same type of cross as Jesus."

### OUR LADY OF FATIMA FIRST SATURDAYS DEVOTION

The elements of this devotion consist of four points, all of which must be offered in reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. One should make this intention before carrying out Our Lady's request, *on the First Saturday of five successive months*,

1. go to confession, 2. receive Holy Communion, 3. say five decades of the Rosary, and 4. keep Our Lady company for a quarter of an hour, meditating on the twenty mysteries of the Rosary.

Here at Sacred Heart, the devotion continues next Sat., Dec. 1st. You are invited to attend the 9:00 AM Mass in the convent chapel and receive Holy Communion. After the Mass the Most Holy Rosary will be recited with Fatima Prayers. After, you are invited to spend 15 minutes in silent meditation on the mysteries of the rosary. The sacrament of Reconciliation will also be available in the church on Saturday, 11:30AM - 12:30 PM and 4:00 - 4:45PM

**FOLLOWING THE 1:30 PM SPANISH MASS**

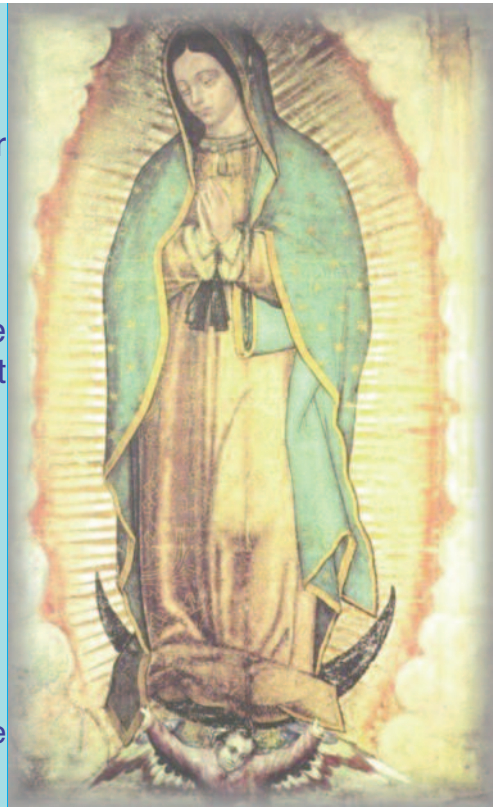
A procession with mariachis will leave the church and make its way to the school cafeteria where there will be great music, delicious food, raffles, and other entertainment.
