Dear Brothers and Sisters,

There is a story about a man who went to heaven. He was met at the gate by St. Peter, who said, "It will take 1.000 points for you to be admitted. The good works you did during your lifetime will determine your points. "The man said, "Unless I was sick, I attended church every Sunday, and I sang in the choir". "That will be 50 points", Peter said. "And I gave to the church liberally," the man added. "That is worth 25 more points", said Peter. Grace is God's unconditional forgiveness offered to the unworthy. It is God's enabling power given to overcome the challenges of life. Grace is the quality in God which moves Him to do good to us even though we do not deserve it. Grace is God giving Himself to man. It is divine life itself: God coming to make His home in us. We receive God's grace without any merit from our part. And we do good as answer to God's grace.

In this New Year, let us always remember that God's grace accompanies us in every moment of our life. And every moment of our life should be a loving answer to the grace of God. Happy New Year!

#### BEGIN THE NEW YEAR HONORING OUR LORD BY HONORING HIS MOTHER



Eight days after the feast of the birth of Christ, we remember the Blessed Virgin Mary by celebrating her divine motherhood. As the Mother of God, Mary is known as Theotokus, which means the "God-Bearer". It is fitting to honor Mary as Mother of Jesus, following the birth of Christ. When Catholics celebrate the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God, we are not only honoring Mary, who was chosen among all women throughout history to bear God incarnate, but we are

also honoring our Lord, who is fully God and fully human. Calling Mary "Mother of God" is the highest honor we can give her.
"Mary, the all-holy ever-virgin Mother of God, is the masterwork of

the mission of the Son and the Spirit in the fullness of time. For the first time in the plan of salvation and because his Spirit had prepared her, the Father found the dwelling place where his Son and his Spirit could dwell among men. In this sense the Church's Tradition has often read the most beautiful texts on wisdom in relation to Mary. Mary is acclaimed and represented in the liturgy as the "Seat of Wisdom."


