

Fourth Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

When Jesus began His public ministry, preaching in the synagogues of Nazareth and Capernaum, the people spoke highly of Him and were amazed at His gracious words.

But things changed quickly when he began to challenge their ideas or convictions. They knew they were the chosen people and to be given the stories of the prophets Elijah and Elisha going outside to pagan peoples to work the wonders of God was not pleasant to their hearing. Jesus had gone beyond what they wanted to hear. Jesus was speaking a universal message from God, salvation for all. St. Cyril of Alexandria, the great church father said that those who heard Jesus speak treated his words as worthless.

The same happens today. When we hear words pleasing to us, we accept them, but when they disturb our consciences we might well dismiss them as worthless. Certainly it is true that the gospel is a great word of consolation and refreshment, but it can also be harsh and demanding, as Jesus himself could be harsh and demanding. Our "precious" savior can also be an "angry" God. The people in the synagogue were so upset they wanted to drive Jesus over the edge of a cliff, but His time had not yet come. When we listen to the gospel, it is good to do so with an open heart and mind. The Church will guide us and teach us. The Holy Spirit will instruct us in all things and help us discern how to respond to the gospel in our lives.

SAINT AGATHA

As in the case of Agnes, another virgin-martyr of the early Church, almost nothing is historically certain about this saint except that she was martyred in Sicily during the persecution of Emperor Decius in 251. Legend has it that Agatha, like Agnes, was arrested as a Christian, tortured, and sent to a house of prostitution to be mistreated. She was preserved from being violated, and was later put to death. She is claimed as the patroness of both Palermo and Catania. The year after her death, the stilling of an eruption of Mt. Etna was attributed to her intercession. As a result, apparently, people continued to ask her prayers for protection against fire. The scientific modern mind winces at the thought of a volcano's might being contained by God because of the prayers of a Sicilian girl. Still less welcome, probably, is the notion of that saint being the patroness of such varied professions as those of foundry workers, nurses, miners and Alpine guides. Yet, in our historical precision, have we lost an essential human quality of wonder and poetry, and even our belief that we come to God by helping each other, both in action and prayer? St. Agatha is the patron saint of Sicily, bellfounders, breast cancer patients, Palermo, rape victims, and wet nurses. She is also considered to be a powerful intercessor when people suffer from fires. Her feast day is celebrated on February 5th.

Saint Agatha, you suffered sexual assault and indignity because of your faith and purity. Help heal all those who are survivors of sexual assault and protect those women who are in danger. Amen Saint Agatha, pray for us!

FEBRUARY IS HEART MONTH A MEMBER OF OUR PARISH FAMILY GIVES WITNESS

When I had a Heart Attack at age 40 I was shocked, scared, confused and had all kinds of emotions running through my mind. How could this happen? A Mom of 3 children, happily married, healthy and had no pre existing medical conditions. This Heart Attack was called SCAD (Spontaneous Coronary Artery Dissection) that is rare but not so rare and strikes healthy young women the average age being 42. caused when a sudden tear occurs within the layers of one or more of the arteries to the heart. This tear blocks blood flow causing a heart attack. It can often strike new moms and pregnant women. On 4/16/19 it will be 3 years since that day changed my life forever and I realize after the journey I have been through to heal and recover both emotionally and physically that God is in control of our life. To trust him. He was with me every step of the way and I believe this happened to bring me closer to the Lord. My faith needed to be strengthened and this has helped it grow tremendously and brought such wonderful people into my life. I would like you all to count your blessings daily, pick up your Cross evey day and THANK the Lord daily. Continue to lean on the Lord through good and bad times and know that He is in control of our destiny. He knows the Plan He has for our lives. Always remain courageous even on the weakest of days and never give up. Prayer is so powerful. 
